Below is a range of questions, a small reading list and list of materials that will support your progression onto studying A-Level History at QE.

Whilst studying A-Level History you will study two topics throughout both the first and second year of the course:

- Unit 1 The Tudors, England 1485-1603
- Unit 2 The Cold War, c1945 -1991

In preparation for A-Level study it would be worth researching the time periods directly preceding the start of the time periods in study:

- Unit 1 The Wars of the Roses and Religion in England
- Unit 2 International relations in the 1930s and then the experiences of the USSR and the Allies in WWII.

As the perfect starting point for your studies, it would be worth researching and answering the following questions:
