Kent Community Health	Early Intervention for Psychosis (East Kent) The East Kent Team helps people who live in Ashford, Canterbury, Dover, Folkestone and Thanet. We work with people between 14 and 65 years old who are experiencing their first episode of psychosis and who have been experiencing symptoms for less than three years. The NHS England standard requires that people experiencing their first episode of psychosis start a NICE recommended package of care within two weeks of referral. We offer advice, carry out assessments and can offer support for up to three years. We can advise you about how mental ill health can be identified early and how our service can help. Assessments and interventions are provided by care coordinators who may be mental health nurses, occupational therapists, or social workers. Our psychology team also provides interventions. Support time and recovery workers are a vital part of the team, and they assist people with ordinary practical activities to help their recovery.
